

Mark D. Waldron received his undergraduate degree from Washington State University in 1976 and his law degree from the University of Puget Sound School of Law (now Seattle University School of Law) in 1979. He resides with his wife and child in Gig Harbor, Washington. Mr. Waldron was born and raised in Washington and graduated in 1972 from Curtis High School in Tacoma, Washington.

Mr. Waldron is a shareholder in the Tacoma law firm of Orlandini & Waldron, P.S., a firm he started with John L. Orlandini in 1981, after having worked as an associate attorney for another law firm upon graduating from law school and passing the bar exam.
